

Fact One: Jesus was a real historical person.



Pliny the Younger (112 A.D.) - "They declared that the sum total of their guilt or error amounted to no more than this; they had met regularly before dawn on a fixed day to chant verses alternately among themselves in honor of Christ as to a god, and also to bind themselves by oath, not for any criminal purpose...

... but to abstain from theft, robbery, and adultery, to commit no breach of trust and not to deny a deposit when called upon to restore it ... I am all the more inclined to believe this since, in search for the truth, I tortured two of their serving girls — whom they call "deaconesses."

Fact Two: Jesus really died on a Roman cross.

Tacitus (115 A.D.) - "Nero fastened the guilt [of the burning of Rome] and inflicted the most exquisite torture on a class hated for their abominations, called Christians by the populace. Christus, from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of our procurator, Pontius Pilatus." Annals 15.44 Lucian of Samosata (180 A.D.) - "The Christians, you know, worship a man to this day — the distinguished personage who introduced their novel rites, and was crucified on that account."

Fact Three: Jesus' disciples were eye-witnesses of the resurrection and they passed what they saw down to others.

³ For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, ⁴ that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, ⁵ and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve.

1 Corinthians 15:3-8 (NIV 2011)

⁶ After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, ⁸ and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born.

Irenaeus (130-202 A.D.) - "But Polycarp also was not only instructed by apostles, and conversed with many who had seen Christ, but was also, by apostles in Asia, appointed bishop of the Church in Smyrna, whom I also saw in my early youth, for he tarried [on earth] a very long time,...

...and, when a very old man, gloriously and most nobly suffering martyrdom, departed this life, having always taught the things which he had learned from the apostles."

Fact Four: The explosion of a new worldview was on the scene.


