Deconstruction

Dismantle that belief: What about farms and stores?

Reconstruction

Belief: Ultimately food comes from God, but not directly.

Deconstruction The process of dismantling one's beliefs.

John the Baptist

Construction: Jesus is the Messiah who will bring the Kingdom – immediately.

Deconstruction: But the Kingdom has not come. Is Jesus the Messiah?

⁴ Jesus replied, "Go back and report to John what you hear and see: ⁵ The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor. ⁶ Blessed is anyone who does not stumble on account of me."

Construction - Deconstruction - Reconstruction

- 1. It can happen to anyone.
- 2. Deconstruction can come from mistaken expectations.

John the Baptist - Mistaken Expectation

Expectation: If Jesus is the Messiah, I should not be in prison.

Deconstruction: Maybe Jesus is not the Messiah.

Christians Today - Mistaken Expectation

Expectation: People who call themselves Christians follow Jesus.

Deconstruction: But many times, Christians don't follow Jesus.

Construction - Deconstruction - Reconstruction

- 1. It can happen to anyone.
- 2. Deconstruction can come from mistaken expectations.
- 3. We are most vulnerable to walk away from the faith when we go through the deconstruction process alone.
