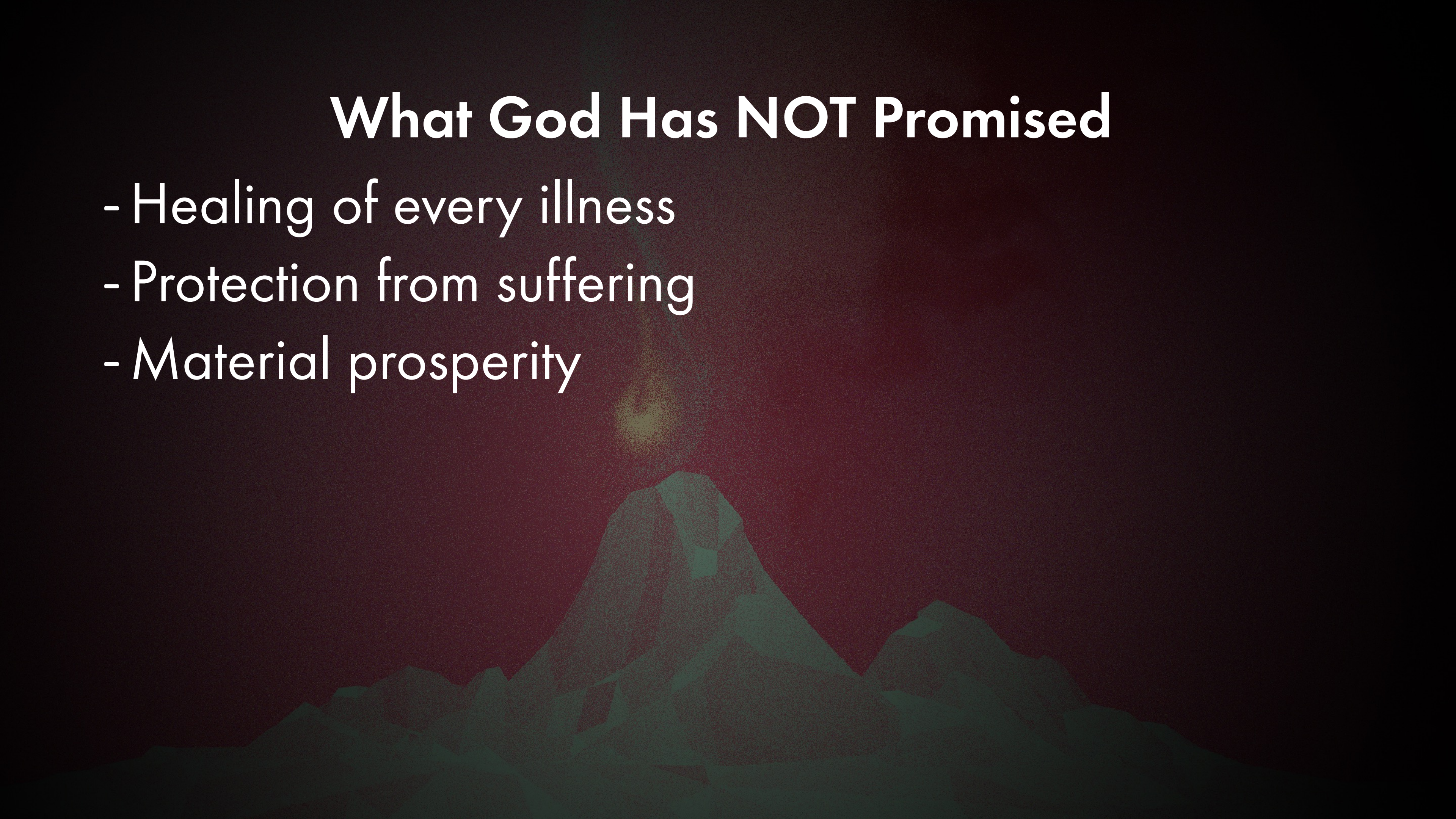
# What God Has Promised

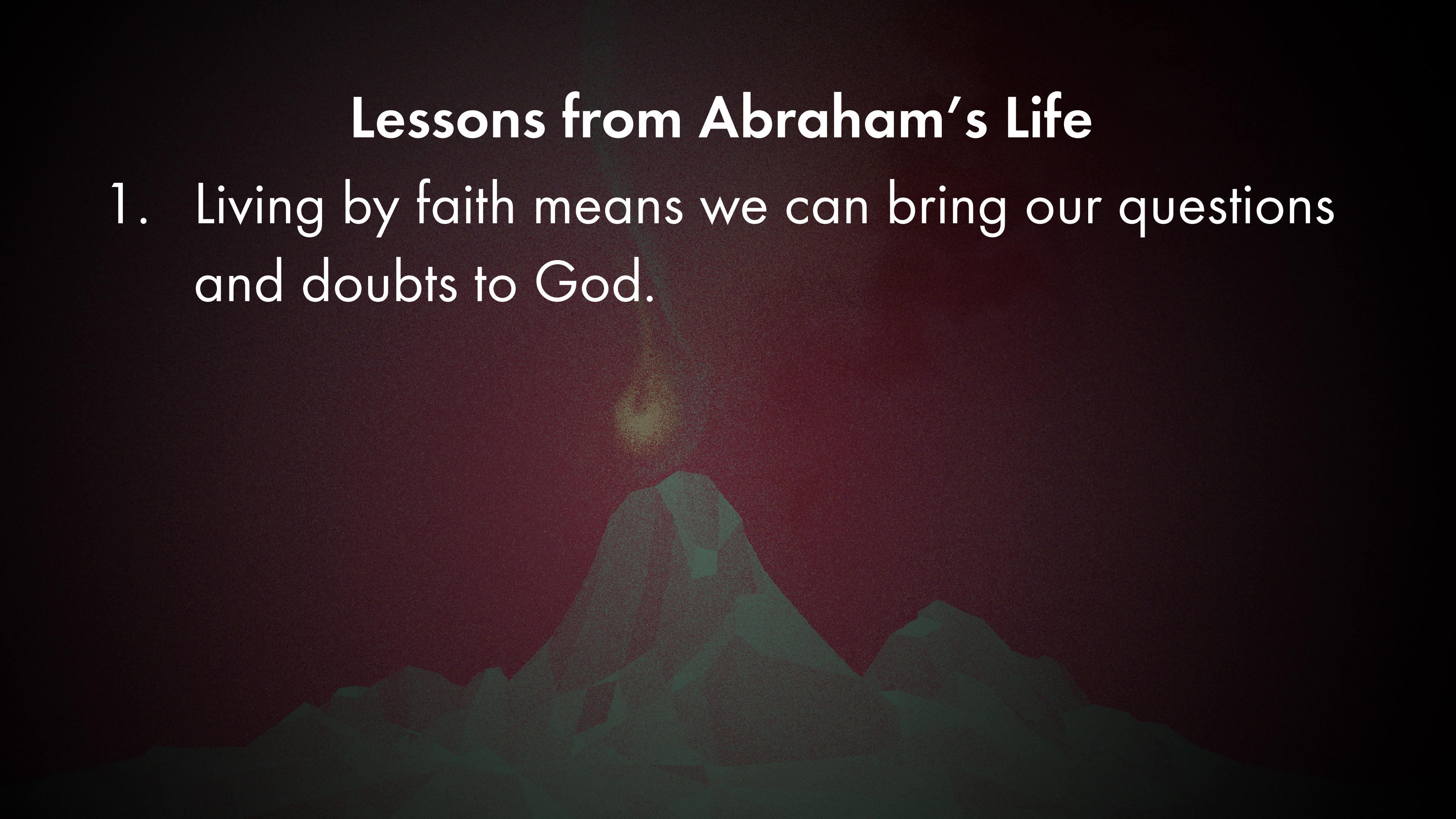

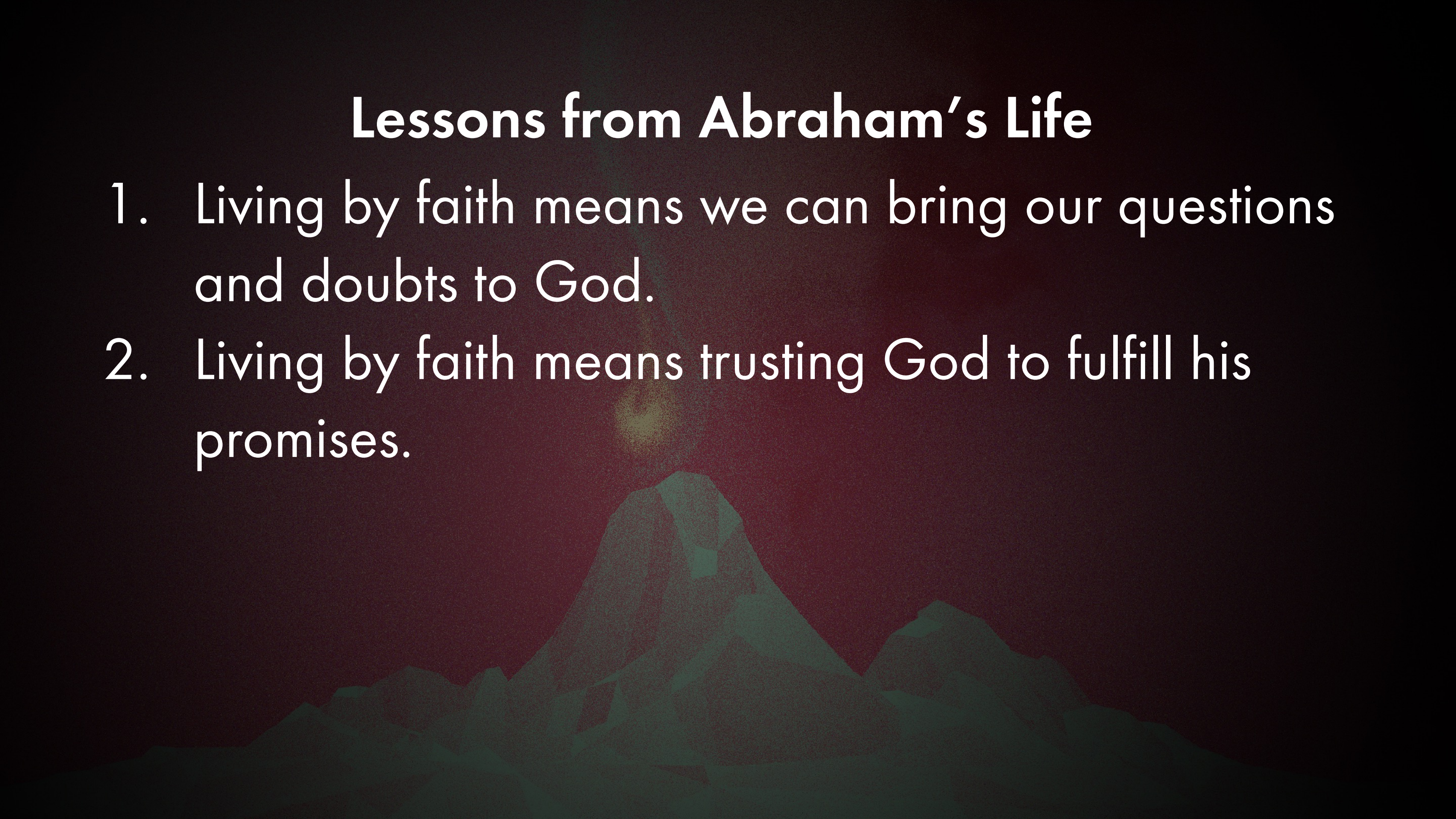
